SUNDAY MASSES AT OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE CHURCH:
 Next Sunday we will begin our full weekend summer mass schedule at Our Lady of Guadalupe Mission Church on Route 17, three miles south of Hocker's Supermarket. Many of you already attend mass on Saturday evening and Sunday morning at 9AM on a regular basis and we would encourage you to continue to do so throughout the summer. We will also be having masses through Labor Day at 7:30AM and 10:30AM on Sunday morning. We would suggest that you consider attending these masses at Our Lady of Guadalupe rather than at St. Ann's at the same times as this will help to alleviate the usual summer "crush" at St. Ann's. We would offer that traffic on Route 17 in Roxana is minimal compared to Route 26 in Bethany; we have also found that the parking lot at Our Lady of Guadalupe clears even when full in less than 10 minutes as opposed to St. Ann's letting out onto Route 26! We would also remind you that the Saturday evening mass at Our Lady of Guadalupe during the summer months will be at 5PM rather than 5:30PM as in the off-season.

LECTIO DIVINA AT SAINT ANN'S CONTINUES:

Lectio Divina is a centuries old Christian traditional practice intended to engender communion with God and increase knowledge of God's Word. In *Dei Verbum 2005*, Pope Benedict said: "I would like in particular to recall and recommend the ancient tradition of *Lectio Divina* : this diligent reading of Sacred Scripture accompanied by prayer brings about that intimate dialogue in which the person reading hears God who is speaking, and in praying responds to him with trusting openness of heart. If it is effectively promoted, this practice will bring to the Church- I am convinced of it-a new spiritual springtime". This method of scriptural prayer was reintroduced at St. Ann's during this past Fall and repeated in Lent and once in the Easter Season. The Christian Formation Committee with the participating group plan to schedule *Lectio Divina* four times during the summer season and you are welcome to join. It is a simple, quiet, reflective form of prayer, easy to learn and especially conducive to lending a contemplative flavor to your vacation or summer respite. Adults interested in coming are invited to the Masterson Center Library at 9:30 on Wednesdays, July 1st, 8th, 15th and 22nd. No preparation or registration is required and we will be using the gospel of the coming Sunday. All are welcome.
